We have five area campuses across Devon. Campuses are centres of excellence that provide placements, support and host Intensive Training and Practice weeks. When you start training with us you will be part of one of our local campus communities.

The SWIFT Mid Devon and Somerset Campus Office and Secondary Lead is based at the Uffculme School, while our Primary Lead is Uffculme Primary school. We currently have 11 schools providing placements across the Campus area, some of which are part of Multi Academy Trusts; Blackdown Partnership, Ventrus and First Federation.

Because the schools in the Mid-Devon and Somerset Campus have a range of rural and urban locations, they offer a broad array of experiences which will ensure all trainees acquire an excellent variety of teaching and learning opportunities across their placements. A benefit of the rich and diverse school communities in our campus is that trainees will undertake their teaching practice with the support of highly experienced school practitioners, working alongside colleagues with a wealth of knowledge about their subjects and phases, with many specialist teachers and leaders.

Our schools also provide trainees with the chance to teach students from varied demographics, with a breadth of needs. All of our schools have inclusion and adaptive teaching at the forefront of their school values and visions and will support all trainees to best prepare them for teaching beyond their training year.

Between them, our schools also offer unique additional aspects such as: nurseries, A-Level phases, nurture-bases for SEND pupils, pupil enrichment experiences, access to gyms, and many more exciting school-specific attributes, which can be explored in more detail through each school's individual website.

As a result of the school networks within the campus, and wider MAT and SWIFT partnership communities, trainees will be at the forefront of potential recruitment opportunities that arise in schools where they train. The schools within our campus are keen to support our next generation of teachers and welcome you into the first stages of the profession, where you will teach and learn along-side us.

Free Subject Knowledge Foundations for Teaching Physics



If you are starting **science teacher training**, The Ogden Trust are offering FREE subject knowledge foundation

sessions to help you to deepen and secure your physics knowledge. This course provides the foundation knowledge you need for teaching physics at KS3 or even GCSE. If you have a physics education background, the sessions will refresh your learning and help you focus your thinking on the most important bits you might have to teach. If you don't see yourself as a physicist, the course will provide the physics foundation subject knowledge you need for the classroom.

The course will include:

- Six online one-hour sessions of synchronous learning.
- Each week will cover a core physics topic from KS3/GCSE content.
- Each session will be designed as a standalone and will not require preparation or homework.
- There will be opportunities to engage with activities during the sessions (optional) using easily available equipment. We will provide details of what will be needed in advance.
